


Lector A Reading from the Book of Revelation.



"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. Kindly let the usher know if you need the clergy to bring the bread to you.



+ THIS IS OUR STORY +

"Frank", or pure incense, is the solidified resin of certain tropical trees. The priest or bishop spoons incense over three small cakes of burning charcoal carried in a thurible. The incense is then blessed. The lit charcoal burns the incense which produces the sweet smelling smoke. God commanded Moses and His chosen people to use incense. The Church using incense in its worship continues this tradition. "In every place incense shall be offered unto my name..." wrote the author of the final Old Testament book (Malachi 1:11). Here, and elsewhere in the Old Testament, the use of incense in Jewish worship is described. In Exodus 30:1-10, Moses was commanded to "make an altar to burn incense," and place it "just outside the veil, near the place of mercy that is above the Ark (of the Covenant)..." where God met and talked with Moses - perhaps the most revered site on earth for the Jewish people. Aaron was instructed to "burn fragrant incense on the altar every morning when he tends the lamps", and "he must burn incense again when he lights the lamps at twilight so incense shall burn regularly before the Lord for generations to come."
