Welcome to St. Augustine of Canterbury Episcopal Church!

We are pleased you have chosen to join us for worship during this Epiphany season.

The major themes and images of the Epiphany season are readily apparent. The reading for the day of Epiphany clearly marks it as a celebration of light, with the prophet Isaiah singing out: "Arise, shine for your light has come!" It is a time for rejoicing in the light that shines in our darkness, the light that reveals both our sin and the one who comes to forgive. The word *Epiphania* in the Greek means to unveil, unwrap or to show forth. Indeed for a world that many times is cloaked in darkness, unwrapping the light that is seen in Christ is vital to life itself.

That light which began to unfold at the celebrations of the Nativity and the Day of the Epiphany now continue at the Baptism of Jesus and meanders through the early ministry, and then finally in a great burst at the Sunday of the Transfiguration. Throughout the Sundays we are reminded of the power found in the waters of baptism and how we are called "Beloved" of God. It is at the baptismal font we are immersed in the light of God's love and forgiveness. It is also at the font that we are commissioned and called to be active participants in the mission and ministry of Christ in the world.

You will notice that the images of light and water are prevalent in our worship space and corporate worship throughout these weeks. We invite you to open your eyes and see the various ways we try to not only depict but celebrate our baptismal calling and consecrate ourselves to the Lord's mission in the world. What we are trying to hold up during this season can be summed up this way: "Through Baptism God has made us members of the priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and bear his creative and redeeming Word to all the world."

If this is your first time in the Episcopal Church, everything you need to follow worship is in this Worship Guide. If you have <u>any</u> questions please do not hesitate to ask anyone around you for help.

The Baptismal Covenant


Dear People of God: In Holy Baptism we follow the pattern of our Lord Jesus Christ. As he came up from the waters he was anointed by the Spirit of God and designated as God's Son. So we also are anointed by that same Spirit; we are reborn and adopted as sons and daughters with whom God is well pleased. Let us now renew our own baptismal covenant.


Lector A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy



Epiphany is a time when we bask in the light & lift up the message of Christ being revealed & shared among all nations. During this season, we will have an opportunity to partake in bread & wine from the seven continents. This week, we celebrate the continent of Asia with Naan from India and a White Meritage from Lebanon. Come enjoy and experience the diversity of cultures, which is a gift from God. Communion Distribution

All Baptized are invited to receive the Holy Meal at the Lord's Table. For Communion, come forward as the ushers release you from your seat.

If you wish to receive the bread dipped in wine, please receive a napkin from an usher. The bread will be dipped in the wine for you by the clergy, then placed on the napkin. After consuming the bread, please place the napkin in one of the wicker receptacles.

If you wish to receive bread only or wine from the common cup, do not receive a napkin, but approach the priest with cupped hands.

To drink from the cup, please consume the bread and help the chalice bearer guide the cup to your lips. Continue down the outside aisle to return to your seat.

Please note that gluten-free bread is available for those who request it.

Kindly let the usher know if you need the clergy to bring the bread to you.

If you wish to only receive a blessing, cross your arms over your chest.

After receiving Communion, please feel free to kneel at the Altar Rail and take time for personal prayer and reflection.



+ THIS IS OUR STORY +

St. Brigid, Patrick, and Columbo, are the patron saints of Ireland. Brigid's feast day is February 1. She was born in 451 AD, the daughter of Dubhthach, court poet to King Loeghaire, and Brocca, a Christian slave. Brigid's charity seemed boundless, and she was incessantly giving away possessions to the needy. This generosity so irritated her father, that he attempted to sell her into slavery. However, King Loeghaire, a Christian, convinced Dubthach to grant Brigid her freedom. Brigid founded a monastery at Kildare on the site of a pagan shrine housing an eternal flame. Rather than extinguish the flame, Brigid gave it a Christian tradition. She founded a school of art that produced the beautifully illuminated Book of Kildare, which was lost during the Reformation. Sts. Brigid and Patrick formed a friendship of charity described as "one heart and one mind". When Patrick heard Brigid's vows to become an abbess, he accidentally used the form for ordaining a priest, an action he refused to reverse. Brigid's skull was purportedly carried to Lumiar, Portugal, by crusading Irish knights. However, she may have been reburied with the relics of Sts. Patrick and Columbo in Down Cathedral, Ireland, during the Scandinavian raids.
