

Welcome to St. Augustine of Canterbury Episcopal Church!

We are pleased you have chosen to join us for worship during this Epiphany season.

The major themes and images of the Epiphany season are readily apparent. The reading for the day of Epiphany clearly marks it as a celebration of light, with the prophet Isaiah singing out: "Arise, shine for your light has come!" It is a time for rejoicing in the light that shines in our darkness, the light that reveals both our sin and the one who comes to forgive. The word *Epiphania* in the Greek means to unveil, unwrap or to show forth. Indeed for a world that many times is cloaked in darkness, unwrapping the light that is seen in Christ is vital to life itself.

That light which began to unfold at the celebrations of the Nativity and the Day of the Epiphany now continue at the Baptism of Jesus and meanders through the early ministry, and then finally in a great burst at the Sunday of the Transfiguration. Throughout the Sundays we are reminded of the power found in the waters of baptism and how we are called "Beloved" of God. It is at the baptismal font we are immersed in the light of God's love and forgiveness. It is also at the font that we are commissioned and called to be active participants in the mission and ministry of Christ in the world.

You will notice that the images of light and water are prevalent in our worship space and corporate worship throughout these weeks. We invite you to open your eyes and see the various ways we try to not only depict but celebrate our baptismal calling and consecrate ourselves to the Lord's mission in the world. What we are trying to hold up during this season can be summed up this way: "Through Baptism God has made us members of the priesthood we all share in Christ Jesus, that we may proclaim the praise of God and bear his creative and redeeming Word to all the world."

If this is your first time in the Episcopal Church, everything you need to follow worship is in this Worship Guide. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask anyone around you for help.



The Baptismal Covenant

Dear People of God: In Holy Baptism we follow the pattern of our Lord Jesus Christ. As he came up from the waters he was anointed by the Spirit of God and designated as God's Son. Eucharistic Prayer B

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

We do so in the context of an ever growing multi-cultural & ethnically diverse congregation. Epiphany is a time when we bask in the light & lift up the message of Christ being revealed & shared among all nations. During this season, we will have an opportunity to partake in bread & wine from the seven continents. This week, we celebrate the continents of Oceania - Australia & New Zealand with Australian Brown Bread and a Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand. Come enjoy and experience the diversity of cultures, which is a gift from God. Taste and see that the Lord is good.

Communion Distribution

All Baptized are invited to receive the Holy Meal at the Lord's Table. For Communion, come forward as the ushers release you from your seat.

If you wish to receive the bread dipped in wine, please receive a napkin from an usher. The bread will be dipped in the wine for you by the clergy, then placed on the napkin. After consuming the bread, please place the napkin in one of the wicker receptacles.

If you wish to receive bread only or wine from the common cup, do not receive a napkin, but approach the priest with cupped hands.

To drink from the cup, please consume the bread and help the chalice bearer guide the cup to your lips.

Continue down the outside aisle to return to your seat.

Please note that gluten-free bread is available for those who request it.

Kindly let the usher know if you need the clergy to bring the bread to you.

If you wish to only receive a blessing, cross your arms over your chest.

+ THIS IS OUR STORY +

Before the ratification of our current Book of Common Prayer in 1979, Lent was preceded by a three Sunday preparation for Lent called the Pre-Lenten season. Septuagesima Sunday was the first Sunday of the season falling three Sundays before Lent and nine Sundays before Easter (which is today). The name implies preceding Easter by seventy days, but Easter is actually celebrated sixty-four days later. The second and third Sundays of the Pre-Lenten season were Sexagesima and Quinquagesima, respectively. Their names implied sixty and fifty days before Easter, but Sexagesima Sunday preceded Easter by only fifty-seven days. It was only Quinquagesima Sunday that accurately implied that it preceded Easter by fifty days. The dating inaccuracies may have been an approximate backward reckoning from Quinquagesima. The Pre-Lenten season dates from the fifth century in Rome. These Sundays last appeared in our 1928 Book of Common Prayer's calendar, and purple was their liturgical color. The Pre-Lenten season was suppressed by the Catholic church in 1969, but these Sundays still persist on the Church of England's calendar. Our Book of Common Prayer in lieu of the Pre-Lenten season emphasizes the Epiphany season's themes until the first day of Lent on Ash Wednesday.
